


CALL FOR DIALOGUES 2020

SENECA FALLS DIALOGUES

“DISRUPTING THE PAST, QUESTIONING THE PRESENT, AND BUILDING THE FUTURE”



October 23-25, 2020

The biennial Dialogues are a collaborative effort to reinvigorate Seneca Falls as a site of feminist activism and intellectual exchange. Acknowledging the 1848 women's rights convention, the Seneca Falls Dialogues moves beyond earlier narratives to bring together activists, artists, students, academics and community members to foster collaborative learning and feminist action.

The 2020 Dialogues will mark the centennial of the 19th amendment, recognizing both its historical importance and the unequal effects of the legislation. We will also mark the 2020 Presidential election year whose outcome will have consequences for our planet and for the most vulnerable amongst us. In this time of chaos, complexity and change, the 2020 Dialogues seeks to provoke discussion, inspire action, and foster community.

We welcome proposals for Dialogue, which should indicate how presenters will organize information, pose questions, and facilitate activities and conversation. Priority will be given to proposals that are interactive and depart from the traditional academic presentation. We especially encourage undergraduates and activists to apply. Dialogues must integrate the conference theme — “Disrupting the Past, Questioning the Present, and Building the Future” — into the proposal. Sub-themes include but are not limited to:

- **Elections and Democracy**
- **Decolonizing Pedagogy**
- **Digital Disruptions**
- **Activism: Local and Global**
- **Bodies and Identities**
- **Art and Performance**
